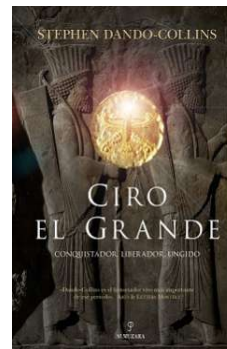

During the roughly hundred years (ca. 1225 – 1125 BCE) that the Middle Assyrian dunnu at Tell Sabi Abyad was in operation, some forty-nine individuals were interred in graves of a striking diversity. In this book their burial type, location, orientation, position, grave goods and osteological data are analysed in order to generate new insights on Middle Assyrian society. Most graves appear to have been inhumation graves dug into abandoned spaces in and around the settlement.

Desde su descubrimiento a comienzos del siglo XX la cueva de es Culleram, un santuario rupestre próximo al litoral noreste de la isla de Ibiza, se reveló como un lugar privilegiado para el estudio de la religiosidad fenicio-púnica. Hallazgos posteriores abundaron en el mismo sentido y confirmaron que en él se daba culto a Tinnit, la diosa patrona de la ciudad de Ebushim, con seguridad en el siglo II a.C. y, probablemente, antes.

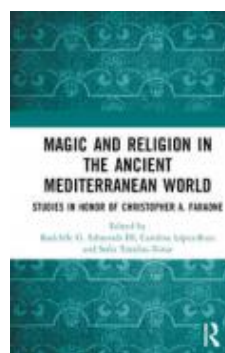

The Luwian language belongs to the Anatolian group of the Indo-European language family and thus constitutes a close relative of Hittite. As a rule, the Luwian cuneiform passages represent incantations embedded in Hittite religious texts. Although their full corpus was published in the twentieth century, no attempts at their cohesive philological translation has been undertaken up to now. This work represents the first step toward achieving this goal.
